MOCK DRILLS

A mock drill is a practice or a trial warning by an institution or an organization, acting as a disaster has happened in that place, mock drill are considered as an integrated part of disaster preparedness. Mock Drill prepares the person to face the hazard both mentally and physically. A perfect plan is obeyed and carried out so that each and every person in the infrastructure is safely evacuated. This helps to practically face the disaster and be ready for it in advance. Mock drills are helpful in a number of ways. Mock Drill helps to achieve accuracy for saving lives and property and help to make Response more cost effective and also minimize response time. The drill even helps to create trained manpower to respond professionally to disasters. Mock Drills are also important as the Awareness generation through the conduct of Mock Drills leads to acceptance by the community. This also helps to evaluate suitability/ practicability of the DM Plan and also to get acquainted with the roles and responsibilities that have been earmarked for all functionaries.

SCHOOL SAFETY INITIATIVES

Each time a disaster occurs, masses of children are excluded from school and many never return. Past experiences and the available evidences show that education sector is among the hardest hit along with other sectors in the event of disasters. Cases like fire accidents, threats to road injury or accidents and stampede are the human made hazards which make schools more vulnerable. Schools located in the urban and rural areas do have different set of vulnerabilities as the nature of hazards and potential threats are different.

There is one common threat between urban and rural schools which is lack of culture of safety in schools to have minimum standards/measures to protect students and teachers from any natural or human made hazard, learning materials and property. Culture of safety in school's capture issues like child's right, education and DRR policies, institutions, governance, resource allocation, disaster preparedness and family inclusion within the framework of internal and external environment of the school to reduce the impact of any possible threats to children.

The framework of culture of safety in school moves around child's right to uninterrupted continuous education, child's right for safe environment and disaster risk reduction. The concept of school safety in its current form includes safety issues both inside and outside the school. It includes issues of child protection and safety that look at all forms of violence and deprivation that affect the physical and mental well-being of children. School Safety is a concept that encompasses "the creation of safe environments for child restarting from their homes to their schools and back.

The year 2019 was dedicated to Child Centric DRR and here with connection to this many School Safety Initiatives have been undertaken. One such initiative is the AMRUT City Program. Here this program would be conducted in a total of 162 schools in four different phases. Out of these four phases, two phases has already been completed. The various schools were awareness programs under this head were conducted by DDMA, Cachar in the School level in the year 2019 are as follows:-

6. Workshop on ERSRT-

This workshop was programme on ERSRT an initiative of ASDMA. The workshop was conducted at NIT Silchar on 6th & 7th December, 2019 Dignitaries from NIT Silchar inaugurated the training programme and delivered lectures on scheduled subjects. Participants from different departments also attended the same.

Here all the 15 schools performed drop cover hold and post that the students & teachers who participated in the event assembled in the emergency assembly point and then the safety check of students was done. There was one or two exhibition venue in each Revenue Circle. All other schools also actively participated in this exhibition, community participation was also seen there and the overall event was a successful one.

The Co-ordination meeting was conducted in the presence of concerned B.E.E.O along with CRCCs, all head-teachers of the participating schools by concerned Field Officer(Disaster Management) of that particular Revenue Circle. In the meeting all about the drill was discussed in detail and necessary formats of reporting, action plan, guidelines, etc were handed over to respective school head-teachers.

A whatsapp group was also immediately formed after the meeting, so that constant monitoring and reporting of work can be done. In this meeting a discussion was also held on the importance of such drills and teachers were advised to perform drop-cover-hold as an integral activity of their school curriculum from time to time, so as to remain better prepared. They were also instructed to permanently construct a board/signage in open area of their school and name it as Emergency Assembly Point so that the students get a fair idea of what needs to be done if such havoc occurs. TRAINING ON SCHOOL FOCAL POINT TEACHERS ON SCHOOL SAFETY UNDER NSSP IN CACHAR DISTRICT

As per the direction of ASDMA 3days Training On School Focal Point Teachers On School Safety Under NSSP was organized by District Disaster Management Authority, Cachar with the help of Lecturers from DIET, Silchar, where they worked as Resource Persons for this training. The program was held on 23rd, 24th & 25th October 2019 where innovative safety techniques were taught to all the participants. The Main mission behind the training was to spread the safety awareness to all through the teachers. Various topics which were discussed in this training program were first aid, Child Friendly Spaces, DRR Road map, School Safety Policy, Relief Camp Management, Right To Education, DM Act, etc The teachers participated actively during the training session and were able to gain much knowledge through practical fire safety sessions as well. Here teachers from 50 different schools were trained and designated as School Focal Point Teachers.

TRAINING OF POLICE PERSONNELS ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT AND TRAUMA MANAGEMENT UNDER CACHAR DISTRICT

1. As per the direction of ASDMA 3days Training Of Police Personnel On Disaster Management and Trauma Management was organized by District Disaster Management Authority, Cachar with the help of NDRF, where they worked as Resource Persons for this training. The program was held on 20th, 21st and 22nd

September 2019, where innovative safety techniques were taught to all the participants. Here 40 nos. Of Police personal were trained in the program. The program was inaugurated by Sri Jagadish Das, Addl. Superintendent of Police, Cachar in presence of Inspector Ist BN NDRF, DPO DDMA, Cachar, Field Officers (DM) and other officials.

The Main mission behind the training was to give specialized training to police personnel. Various topics which were discussed in this training program were first aid, CPR, Fire Safety, preparation of floating aids, earthquakes do's and donts, dead body management etc. The participants participated actively during the training session and were able to gain much knowledge through practical sessions as well.

DISTRICT AND CIRCLE LEVEL CONSULTATION ON ASSAM DRR ROADMAP

For developing this recommendation report, DDMA Cacharhas undertaken a multi-staged outreach, research, processing, compilation, documentation and feedback program in consonance with procedural framework from ASDMA. At the initial level Circle Level Disaster Management Committee (CDMC) meeting was organized at each revenue circle of the district viz., Udharbond, SilcharSadar, Sonai, Katigorah&Lakhipur wherein stakeholders and common citizens shared their valuable experience, opinion, suggestion and information. After completion of CDMC level consultation, the district level consultation under the chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner, Cachar was held. District level stakeholders, central rescue agencies, independent consultants, students, volunteers and others—discussed over the district DRR Roadmap which evolved—some key findings with formulation of action plan.

TRAINING OF MINISTERIAL STAFFS-

District Disaster Management Authority(DDMA), Cachar Organized 4days Ministerial Staff Training from 29th November, 2019 to 4th December, 20189 on Disaster Management where mainly Ministerial Staffs were targeted. In this training program Knowledge on different aspects of Disaster Management, norms in connection to Disaster Management were imparted to the participants with the help of Resource Persons associated with DDMA, Cachar. Moreover, Knowledge on First-Aid and Safety Measures to be taken in case of any emergency were also imparted to the Participants. In this training program a total of 153 number of staffs from various departments were trained and at the end they were provide with a certificate also.

DOCUMENTS/PLANS ETC. PREPARED

Apart from the activities in the field DDMA along with all the five Circle Disaster Management Committees has also prepared various documents like Village Land Use Plan, Village Master Plan, Circle Disaster Management Plan, Circle Flood Contingency Plan, VLMCC Notifications, District Disaster Management Plan, City Disaster Management Plan, Ward Level Disaster Management Plan, Crowd Disaster Management Plans for BaruniMela/Idd-Ul-Fitr/Durga Puja/ Kali Puja, etc.

Apart from these, a detail DM Plan is also being been made for People with Disability, Child centric DM Plan. DDMA Cachar has also supervised the preparation of various Departmental Disaster Management Plans and in Cachar 16 (sixteen) nos. of Departments has already prepared the respective Departmental DM Plan. SMCH & SM Dev Civil Hospital has also prepared draft Hospital DM Plan.
